# **Employment Opportunities**

#### Community Engagement Specialist - Digital Equity

The Economic Development Program seeks a part-time temporary Community Engagement Specialist to speak with Pittsfield community organizations and the individuals they serve about their needs regarding internet access and the barriers preventing them from using it to its full potential. The Specialist will participate in activities to build awareness about Massachusetts Internet for All and programs that support digital equity, such as the Affordable Connectivity Program.

#### Public Health Emergency Preparedness Senior Planner or Planner

BRPC's Public Health program seeks a full-time Planner or Senior Planner specializing in Emergency Preparedness to assist with a broad range of initiatives related to public health and emergencies. This position will contribute to a multitude of dynamic and complex projects to improve public health outcomes in Berkshire County.

#### Public Health Food Specialist

This is a full-time, offsite position for a food protection subject matter expert to enforce the food code and local food-related regulations, conduct environmental health inspections, support the inspectional services program, help develop a new local Public Health Excellence Training Hub, and contribute to a broad scope of dynamic and complex public health inspection and training programs in Berkshire County. Part-time applicants will be considered.

<u>Transportation Senior Planner or Planner</u> The focus of this position is developing and maintaining relationships with stakeholders and the public through active outreach efforts, presentations, and preparing/administering surveys. Projects include the Regional Transportation Plan, Transportation Improvement Program, Unified Planning Work Program, electric vehicle acquisition, and charging station development.

<u>Public Health Housing Specialist</u> Seeking a housing subject matter expert with building code or housing inspection experience, to enforce the housing code and local housing regulations, conduct environmental health inspections, support inspectional services program, and help develop a new local Public Health Excellence Training Hub. #### FHWA PROTECT Notice of Funding Opportunity

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law established the Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) Discretionary Grant Program to help make surface transportation more resilient offering up to \$848 million from Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023. Energy Efficiency and Cost Reduction for Adams, North Adams, and Williamstown Small Businesses!

#### Funding to replace diesel vehicles and equipment

Through the <u>VW settlement</u>, MassDEP is allocating \$7.5 million for zero-emission technologies. As part of the initiative in the <u>2030 Solid Waste Master Plan</u>, funded by the <u>Climate Protection</u> <u>and Mitigation Expendable Trust</u> (CMT), MassDEP is allocating \$4 million to replace municipal waste-serving refuse trucks with more efficient options. This competitive Solicitation is due **September 26, 2023, 5** pm. Details at <u>guidance document</u>.

#### Funding to get "shovel ready"

The U.S. Department of Transportation is accepting applications starting on August 14, 2023, to fund pre-development-phase activities such as feasibility studies, preliminary engineering and design work, environmental review, and economic assessments and cost-benefit analyses. Grants can be used to hire staff or procure expert services to conduct the work needed to help projects like highways, bridges, public transportation, wildlife crossings, and highway-railway grade crossing or grade separation get "shovel ready."



Through the Rural and Tribal Assistance Pilot Program, grant awards between \$150,000 and \$360,000 will be made to help communities evaluate and develop projects that qualify for federal funding and financing programs. **Applications will be accepted between August 14 and** 

**September 27**, with awards made on a first-come, first-served basis. There is no local match required. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

The Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (former DHCD) has released a list of registered subsidized affordable housing units by community under the Subsidized Housing

Inventory per Massachusetts General Laws 40B (click here for more information on 40B).

From EOHLC:

The Subsidized Housing Inventory (SHI) is used to measure a community's stock of low-or moderate-income housing for the purposes of M.G.L. Chapter 40B, . . . This data set deducts seasonal/recreational housing units. In addition, the EOHLC has completed a complete update on units that qualify for the SHI.

# **Environmental & Energy**

#### Green Communities Annual Reporting Assistance

As we get closer to fall, it is time for municipalities with Green Communities designation to think about annual reporting. This year DOER is working to streamline the reporting process to make it easier for smaller municipalities to complete their annual reporting. They are working to implement the entirety of the Annual Report process through Mass Energy Insights. There isn't definitive guidance on how this will change the process, and BRPC will continue to work with our

Municipalities to provide technical assistance.

Participating Green Communities will still need to upload their deliverable fuel usage to Mass Energy Insight to make sure the process goes smoothly. Municipalities must also collect information about Building Stock and Municipal Fleet changes. *It is helpful to start collecting this information before October to ensure there is plenty of time for corrections before the November deadline*. Municipalities who have sought technical assistance funding through DOER's Regional Energy Planning Assistance program will be contacted by September and informed of what projects will be funded through DOER for the 2023-2025 funding round.

## **Public Health**

#### Transportation

#### New Statewide Vehicle Data Tool

MassDOT has developed the *Massachusetts Vehicle Census* (MVC) database. The MVC is a state-level dataset that joins vehicle-level odometer readings with vehicle attributes and registration transaction histories. This powerful resource allows policymakers, researchers, and other stakeholders to understand state and local trends in vehicle usage and ownership.

Some questions that this dataset can answer about actively registered vehicles in the state include:

- Are electric vehicles driven more or less than gas-powered vehicles?

- How many vehicles were added (or subtracted) from my city or town between 2021 and 2022?

- What is the difference in the number of passenger vehicles versus commercially registered vehicles?







Since the first iteration of the MVC was first produced by the Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC) in 2014, the data has been used in several projects and research studies. However, the adoption of a new RMV data management platform known as ATLAS in 2018 and the significant economic and policy emphasis on sustainable transportation technologies - especially electric and zero-emission vehicles - renewed the urgency to expand and update this dataset. The development of this product responds to the legislative requirements defined in Chapter 179 of the Acts of 2022 and is a significant accomplishment for MassDOT and our partners.
