

The BRPC Community Development Program is happy to announce that we are accepting applications for the FY22-23 Sheffield CDBG Housing Rehabilitation Program. This Program provides low to moderate-income Homeowners with 0% interest, deferred payment, forgivable loans to support projects that address deferred maintenance on their homes. The FY2022-23 Program will rehabilitate up to 15 homes in Sheffield. Projects may include items such as replacement of roofs, windows, siding, septic systems and wells.

State of the County Update 2024

Berkshire Benchmarks has released the **2024 State of the County Update**, available online at <u>BerkshireBenchmarks.org</u>. This update highlights notable changes in the regional indicators, including comparisons to comparable counties, when possible. Highlights include a continued increase in self-employed, households making



over \$75,000, and the percentage of conservation framework land protected. The region has also seen a decrease in asthma-related emergency department visits and the percentage of people age 65 and older living alone. Air Quality Monitoring Opportunities

Air pollution poses significant health risks, particularly from fine particulate matter (PM2.5) and carbon monoxide (CO). Monitoring air quality provides data to identify pollution sources, mitigate risks, and implement measures that benefit vulnerable populations and the environment.



NO COST Opportunities for Municipalities:

MassDEP Grant:

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection is offering a grant for tribes, nonprofit organizations, community-based organizations, and municipalities to receive, at no cost, between five and ten PurpleAir sensors to measure PM2.5 levels in outdoor air. The program aims to monitor air quality for at least one year, with applications accepted on a first-come, firstserved basis until funding runs out.

BRPC Initiative:

BRPC is establishing an EPA-funded regional-scale air monitoring initiative in economic justice communities. The initiative will focus on indoor and outdoor levels of CO and PM2.5.

Public Health

Avian Influenza Situation Report

With the recent rise in H5N1 (HPAI: Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza) and the reported transmission to other livestock animals, there has been an increase in concern regarding the current situation. The Berkshire County Boards of Health Association (BCBOHA) remains steadfast in its goal of serving the County's 32 municipalities and disseminating timely pertinent situational updates. In pursuit of this objective, we have developed a situation report for the current spread of H5N1 among livestock that we are now seeing. Pasteurized milk is considered safe to drink as the pasteurization process is known to inactivate viruses. Tests are being conducted to verify that H5N1 is inactivated by the normal milk pasteurization process. Influenza viruses are also not known to be readily transmitted in foods. Consumers are advised to avoid raw (unpasteurized) milk.

We encourage you to share this information with your municipality's Animal Inspector, other officials, and residents as you see fit. Transportation

Freight and Goods Movement Survey

As part of its commitment to ensuring an efficient regional transportation system and facilitating economic development in Berkshire County, BRPC has recently initiated a Freight and Goods Movement Survey to acquire stakeholder input. The survey will provide information for a multifaceted study to identify key factors to improve freight and goods movement in Berkshire County. The insight gained from this survey will be used to develop a freight and goods plan to improve regional goods movement and further regional economic growth.

The first step in this process is soliciting feedback from stakeholders regularly transporting freight and goods throughout the region. As such, BRPC has assembled a cohort of the region's logistics managers, trucking and shipping companies, major distributors and shippers, freight rail customers, and other entities that transport large amounts of freight and goods to and from Berkshire County. By identifying the common logistical challenges businesses confront, BRPC is confident that a roadmap can be developed to provide effective methods, resources, and recommendations for eliminating these barriers and promoting further economic development.

The Freight and Goods Movement Study will continue through the end of the year. Stakeholders involved with freight and goods movement are encouraged to participate in the survey. For more information, please get in touch with Transportation Planner <u>Ryan Griffis</u>.

Berkshire Flyer 2024 Pilot

The Berkshire Flyer is a weekend service operated on Fridays and Sundays between New York Moynihan Train Hall and Pittsfield Station via Albany/Rensselaer by Amtrak with the Massachusetts Department of Transportation and New York State Department of Transportation.



Berkshire Flyer 2024 service will resume on Friday, June 21, and run through Monday, September

2, for Labor Day weekend after two successful pilot years in 2022 and 2023. On Fridays, the train departs Moynihan Train Hall at 3:16 pm and arrives at Joseph Scelsi Intermodal Transportation Center in Pittsfield at 7:27 pm via the Albany-Rensselaer Station. The Sunday return trip will depart Pittsfield at 3:35 pm and arrive in New York at 7:55 pm.

In addition, for the first time this year, the Berkshire Flyer includes a train from New York City to Pittsfield on Sunday mornings. The new Sunday Berkshire Flyer train from New York City to Pittsfield will depart Moynihan Train Hall at 10:50 am and arrive in Pittsfield at 3:15 pm.

In 2022, over 819 passenger trips occurred over a ten-week season; tickets sold out each weekend. In 2023, over 1,271 passenger trips occurred over a twenty-week season. The 2023 pilot service ran from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend. The ridership patterns were the same in 2023 as in 2022 - dominated by trips between New York City and Pittsfield, with less than 10% of riders to/from Albany or other stations. July and August saw the highest ridership.

The riders' survey shows they are here for various purposes: to attend art & cultural events, visit families, and enjoy the natural beauty and adventures in Berkshire County. Berkshire Flyer riders are of all age groups, from millennials to older adults, some new and some visiting again, as riding the Berkshire Flyer train is convenient.

Berkshire Flyer service creates another opportunity to bring visitors to the region and increase tourism. Berkshire County businesses will benefit from continued Berkshire Flyer service in 2024. It improves transportation connections for Berkshire residents by providing a train connection between Pittsfield, Albany/Rensselaer, and other NY destinations.
